Outline

Creating integrated gas markets allowing for cross-border energy trade and integration with the EU market is one of the main objectives of the Energy Community. At the current stage, the Energy Community gas markets are still not well integrated. On the other hand, the diverse picture of gas market development in the Contracting Parties calls for looking into potential market integration options with neighbouring EU Members.

The Workshop will present the results of a study on gas market integration options for Central and South East Europe. The study targets the identification of integration concepts that provide best results in terms of competition increase, cost-benefit analysis and feasibility. Discussing the identified options, implementation requirements and market interest with the gas market stakeholders of Central and South East Europe will be essential to create ownership and commitment for practical implementation steps.
