Treaty reform in a nutshell



- Energy Community viability: unusual even for a young organization
- Lessons learned after 10 years: The EnC is here to stay
- Treaty reform; vision and reality

- Three lead questions for Treaty reform
 - How to better achieve the Treaty's objectives
 - How to keep pace with an ever-changing energy world
 - How to reinvigorate the Contracting Parties' interest in membership and attract new members



1. adaptation to changed circumstances



- ➤ More Fora (not only two Art 63)
- ▶Paris (next to Kyoto Art 13)
- Free movement of capital and services (art 41)



2. Better enforcement





- State aid law enforcement (Art 18 reporting on state aid)
- ➤ Transparency of judicial decisions (decisions in writing Art 92)
- ➤ Enforcement of judicial decisions (measures Art 92)


3. Equal treatment and integrity



- ► Ensure non-discriminatory treatment in terms of rights and obligations on the interface between EU Member States and Contracting Parties (new Art after Art 42 instead of Reciprocity clause in SoS Regulation)
- ➤ Direct applicability of secondary legislation adopted by the Ministerial Council (Network Codes Art 76)

The procedure



- Regular meetings of the PHLG
 - At least bimonthly
 - Timetable to be proposed by Secretariat
- Secretariat will update its proposal in cooperation with parties
- Negotiations for a package nothing is agreed until everything is agreed
- A process including all Parties and interested Member States
- Secretariat proposal to the Ministerial Council by June 2017
