




Implementation of the Sustainability Acquis





WB6 Sustainability Charter





The WB6 endorsed the **Sustainability Charter** (Paris, July 2016) to pursue a transition towards **a low-carbon** and **climate-resilient** energy sector

The Charter is a practical tool to **implement the Paris Agreement** at regional level, including a set of **regulatory, policy and practical measures** in 4 priority areas:

- Improve energy efficiency governance;
- 2. Develop and implement smart support measures for RES;
- 3. Foster climate action;
- Increase transparency of energy markets;

- ☐ Setting up national systems for measures, policies, projections;
- ☐ Reporting regularly (annual/bi-annual) on GHG, updates, projections;
- ☐ Establishing a Regional Climate Change Committee;
- ☐ Preparation of **low-carbon development strategies**;

Provisions of the MMR with EnC relevance



- Exercise based on Art. 2(1) of the Recommendation
- Art. 1 (subject matter)
 - replace Kyoto with NDCs
 - c), d) e) and g) not relevant (ETS, Effort Sharing)
- Art. 2 (scope)
 - f) to h) not relevant (Kyoto)
- Art. 3 (definitions)
 - (7) to (13c) not relevant (Kyoto units)
 - NDCs shall be reflected
- Art. 4 (low-carb strategies)
 - key provision
 - important to link to Paris / NDCs
- Art. 5 (national inventory systems)
 - key provision
 - reference to F-gases regulation / ETS not relevant
- Art. 6 (union inventory system) not relevant

Provisions of the MMR with EnC relevance



- Art. 7 (greenhouse gas inventories)
 - "light" version could be foreseen
 - ECS assistance in the preparation of the inventories prior to submission (similar to the EU peer review system)
 - ETS-related provisions not relevant
- Art. 8 (approximated GHG inventories) not relevant
- Art. 9 (estimates for Union inventory) not relevant
- Art. 10 (registries) not relevant
- Art. 11 (retirement of units) not relevant
- Art. 12 (national measures on PaMs)
 - relevant, but keeping national level only
 - ECS to ensure consistency
- Art. 13 (reporting on PaMs)
 - relevant, but without ex ante and ex post assessments + Kyoto and Effort Sharing refs
- Art. 14 (reporting on projections) relevant, but without ETS reference
- Art. 15 to 17 not relevant

Provisions of the MMR with EnC relevance



- Art. 18 (biannial reports)
 - "light" version could be foreseen
 - "shall endeavour to" + "as voluntary submissions"
- Art. 19 (inventory review)
 - relevant, but link to NDCs
 - no Effort Sharing reference
- Art. 20 not relevant
- Art. 21 (reporting on progress)
 - Link to NDCs
 - ECS to submit report to Min Council each year
- Art. 22 not relevant
- Art. 23 (cooperation between CPs and ECS) key provision
- Art. 24 (role of the EEA) ECS to submit its report to the MC also to the EEA
- Art. 25 not relevant
- Art. 26 (Climate Change Committee) key to institutionalise the climate-related work in the EnC
- Art. 27 to 29, Annexes II-III not relevant
