



WB6 Sustainability Charter

WB6 signed the Sustainability Charter (Paris, July 2016) to pursue a transition towards a **low-carbon** and **sustainable energy** sector. Priority areas:

1. Improve energy efficiency governance

2. Develop and implement smart support measures for renewable energy

3. Improving monitoring, reporting and planning energy and climate policies & align with Regulation (EU) No 525/2013



WB6 Sustainability Roadmap (1)

To kick-off the process, the EnC Secretariat was tasked to:

- **Develop a Sustainability Roadmap** → shared with relevant Ministers for comments and feedback
- **Publish regular reports outlining achievements and challenges** → a set of questionnaires will be shared with relevant interlocutors and followed-up by interviews on the ground



WB6 Sustainability Roadmap (2)

- Implementation of **14 main measures** supported with **sub-measures**
- Implementation **timeframe**: December 2016 - November 2018
- Monitoring of progress: **55 output indicators**
- **Regular reporting**: every 3 months
- First country missions in Nov. 2016: Montenegro, Serbia and Albania
