


Provisional agreement on RED revision

- Revised EU-level target: doubling ambition over next 8 years
- New provisions/revised targets on:
 - Permitting
 - Heating and cooling
 - Industry
 - Transport
 - Buildings
 - Bioenergy



Overall target—the EU-level target (Article 3)

REDII


Overall RES share

At least 32%
EU binding
MS contributions + indicative formula

+ New indicative target for the deployment of innovative technologies: 5% in 2030

Permitting procedures (Article 15-16)

- **RES projects**: easier and faster permitting procedures with two types of areas:
 - Majority of the territory where renewables can be deployed, simpler and faster.

2 years max for all permits (3 years for offshore)

• "Renewables acceleration areas" where environmental impacts are expected to be lower, with shorter deadlines and streamlined environmental assessments per project

1 year max for all permits (2 years for offshore)


- Designation of dedicated areas (optional) for infrastructure projects
 - MS may exempt projects in these areas from an EIA if comply with a mitigation rulebook
 - Screening for exempted projects; mitigation measures for problematic projects

Industry (Articles 22a et 22b)

- <u>Indicative annual increase</u> of at least 1,6 percentage points by 2030 (share of RES in the energy sources used in industry)
- New binding target for RFNBO (renewable fuels of non biological origin):
 - ✓ 42% in 2030
 - ✓ 60% in 2035

Overall RES-H&C target (Article 23)

- Change of pace to align with REPowerEU ambition
- Delivery guaranteed by mandatory element
- Collective effort towards REPowerEU ambition
- Increasing role of RE electricity and waste heat
- Member States should implement at least two measures from a list



District heating and cooling (Art 24)

- Change of pace to align with REPowerEU ambition:
 - ✓ New indicative target of increase by 2,2 percentage points by 2030 (share of RES)
 - ✓ Possibility to count waste heat/cold and renewable electricity used for district heating and cooling

RES in buildings (new Art 15a)

• Indicative national share of 49% RES in energy consumption in buildings sector by 2030

Joint projects (Art 9)

- Obligation for Member States to set a mandatory cooperation framework on joint projects with one or more other Member States for the production of renewable energy, by 31 December 2025.
- Voluntary joint projects requested for all MS.

Energy system integration and e-mobility (Art 20a)

- Information on the share of renewable electricity and GHG emissions content of the electricity supplied
- Battery manufacturers to enable real-time access to battery management system information
- Power recharging points to support smart charging functionalities
- Participation of small or mobile systems in the electricity market + provision of flexibility and balancing services.

Transport

REDII

At least 14 % renewables in transport (road and rail)

+

At least 3,5% advanced biofuels

+

Incentives for advanced biofuels (double counting) + use of fuels in maritime and aviation (1,2x multiplier)

RED revision

At least 29 % renewables in transport (all transport modes)
or

14,5% reduction of emission intensity of fuels

+

At least 5,5% advanced biofuels and RFNBOs (combined target with at least 1% RFNBOs)

+

Incentives for advanced biofuels and RFNBOs (double counting) + incentives for their use in aviation (1,2x or 1,5x multiplier)

Bioenergy

- Strengthened bioenergy sustainability criteria
 - ✓ Apply to smaller installations
 - ✓ Areas of particular importance (biodiversity, carbon stock)
 - ✓ Woody biomass to be used according to cascading use
 - ✓ Restricted financial support

Timeline for NECPs

2023

MS submit Progress Reports 15 March 2023 MS submit draft updated NECPs for 2021-2030 + support contracts

June 2023

Commission assesses draft updated NECPs

31 December 2023:

2024

Member States submit final updated NECPs June 2024

Commission assesses the final updated NECPs



Update of NECPs (Article 14)

- "Member States shall submit to the Commission updated national plans once during the tenyear period to adapt them to **significant changing circumstances**, or shall provide the Commission with reasons why the plan does not require updating."
- The updated NECPs shall reflect "an increased ambition" as regards GHG and equal or increased ambition" as regards RES and EE objective, targets or contributions
- "Member States shall make efforts to **mitigate any adverse environmental impacts** that become apparent as part of the integrated reporting"
- "Member States shall take into consideration the latest country-specific recommendations under the European Semester as well as obligations deriving from the Paris agreement".

Guidance on updated NECPs adopted on 15 December 2022 and published in Official Journal on 27 December 2022
