
Introducing the Governance Regulation

Governance Regulation 2018/1999, and its two Implementing Regulations 2020/1208 and 2022/2299

Monitoring Mechanism Decision (MMD), 2004, was replaced by the Monitoring Mechanism Regulation (MMR) in 2013 which in turn was replaced by the Governance Regulation.

The EU 27 Member States report their climate and energy data, with 5 additional countries reporting parts of their data.


The Governance Regulation was adopted by the Ministerial Council of the Energy Community on 30 November 2021.





Overview of the Adapted Governance Regulation

Stands on five pillars:



Reporting obligations – first deadlines

2023 — 2024 — 2025

15 March (biennial)

- National systems for policies and measures and projections
- Policies and measures (GHG)
- National adaptation planning and strategies

31 July (annual)

 Use of any revenues generated from carbon price mechanisms

15 March

- Significant updates on previously reported data

15 March (biennial)

- GHG projections
- Final GHG inventories
- Integrated energy and climate progress reports, including information on RES and EE

31 July (annual)

- Approximated GHG inventories

30 September (biennial)

Support provided to developing countries

Reporting process

Nomination of Lead Reporters

- Nominations to EnCS
- EEA grants access to Reportnet
- EU Login

Reportnet open for submission


- Opened from the beginning of March
- Will not close for submissions



Quality control process

- Conducted at EEA
- Dialogue between the EEA and CPs
- Re-submissions possible
- Aim is to complement and improve, not to find errors



Provision of technical assistance



In person provision of technical assistance:

Offered to the five Western Balkans CPs with nominated lead reporters were sent in the beginning of June. Carried out in-person trainings in North Macedonia (27/6) and Albania (29/6), while Bosnia & Herzegovina has indicated interest at a later point.

Planned:

Continue to offer this to the remaining CPs with nominated lead reporters. Offers to incoming lead reporters from the CPs will also be shared once there are nominations, and it is deemed useful.

Continued discussion with the CPs to see what type of technical assistance could benefit most.
