Requirements for Wholesale Energy Trading I

- Large number of European Trading Companies are reluctant to expand electricity and gas trading activities towards SEE and CEE countries
- Increase of trading activities, liquididty and trust in these markets are the principle for further investments

Obstacles:

- Requirement of a local tax establishment, subsidiary or branch
- These requirements are linked with high costs for market participants:
 - Offices, staff and set up an entirely new business.
 - Wholesale energy market participants have their trading floors including back and middle office, legal, regulatory, compliance and control functions usually set up within one legal entity.
 - This is primarily done to ensure efficient operation and controls across the business, and to avoid direct exposure to multiple local tax and labour law requirements in Europe

→ All market participants have to register and conclude contracts with relevant system operators (TSO) to provide adequate collaterals

REMIT

→ Obilgation to registrate all relevant datas of market participants in Centralised European Register of Energy Market Participants (CEREMP)

Financing of Regulators

→ Regulatory fee can be collected via network tariff applied to final customers
