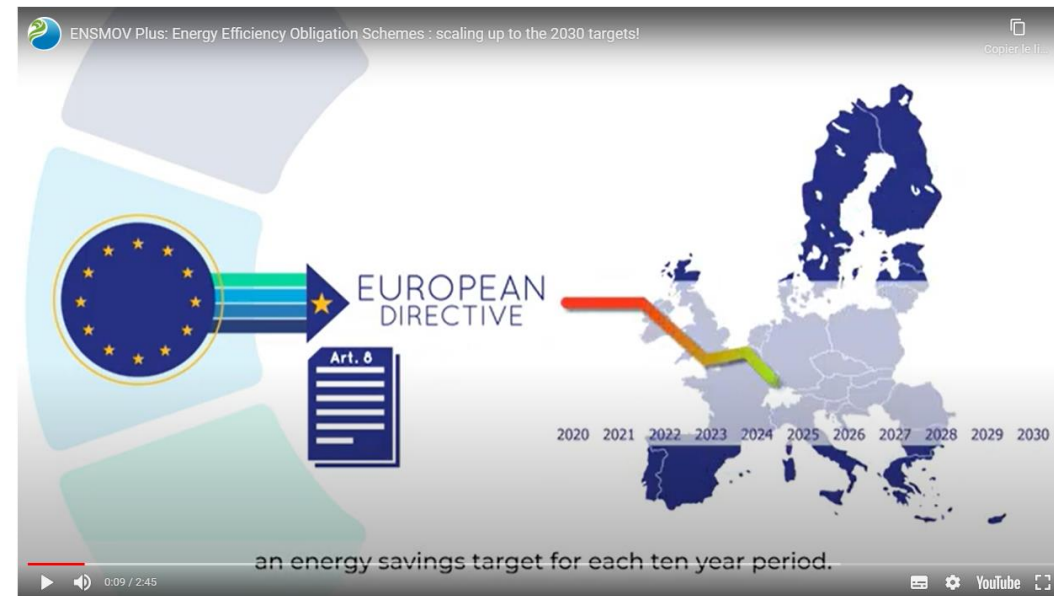
# Member States' energy savings obligation in the EED

- ✓ A **binding** measure equivalent to an energy savings target
- ✓ **Additional** energy savings required to complement other EU laws and regulations
- ✓ Distinction between **EEOS** (Energy Efficiency Obligation Schemes) and **Alternative measures**

Previously: EED 2012/27/EU > Article 7 + Annex V  
(amended by EED (EU)2018/2002)

Now: EED (EU)2023/1791 > Articles 8, 9 and 10 + Annex V

**EnC version:** EED as of 2018 version, adapted by Ministerial Council Decisions (2015/08/MC-EnC, 2021/14/MC-EnC, 2022/02/MC-EnC)

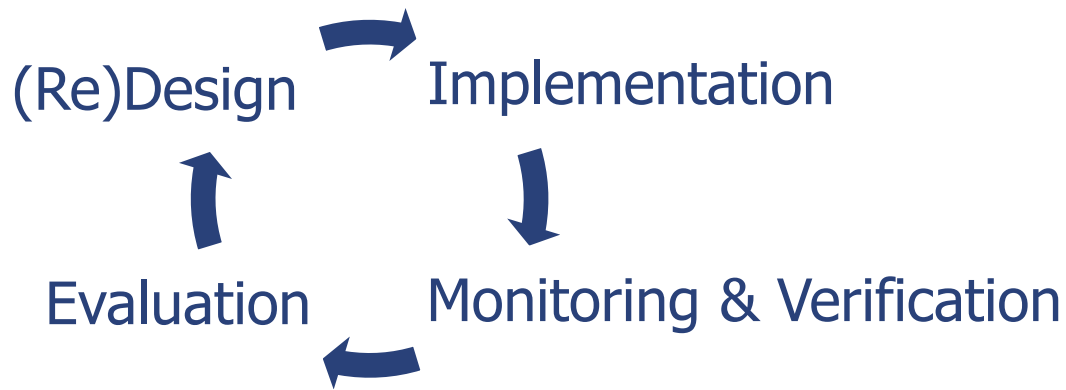

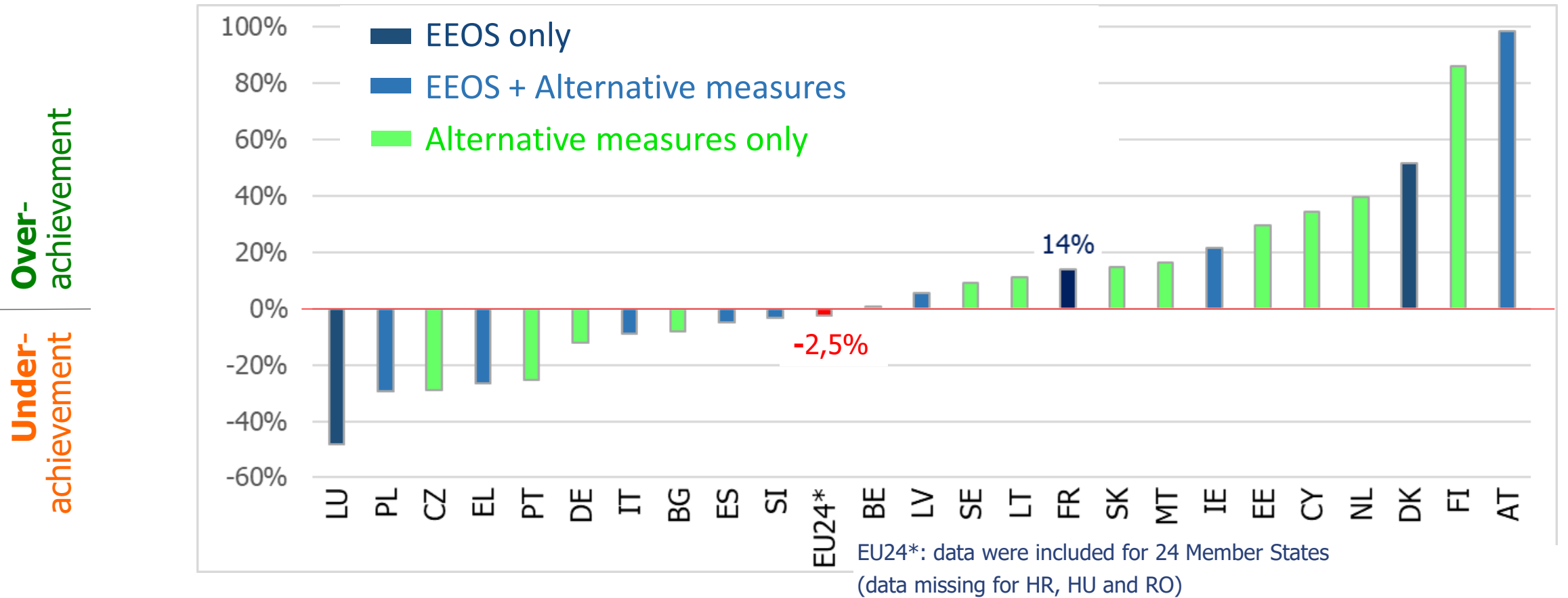

Under- / Over- achievements of required amount of cumulative energy savings for **2014-2020**

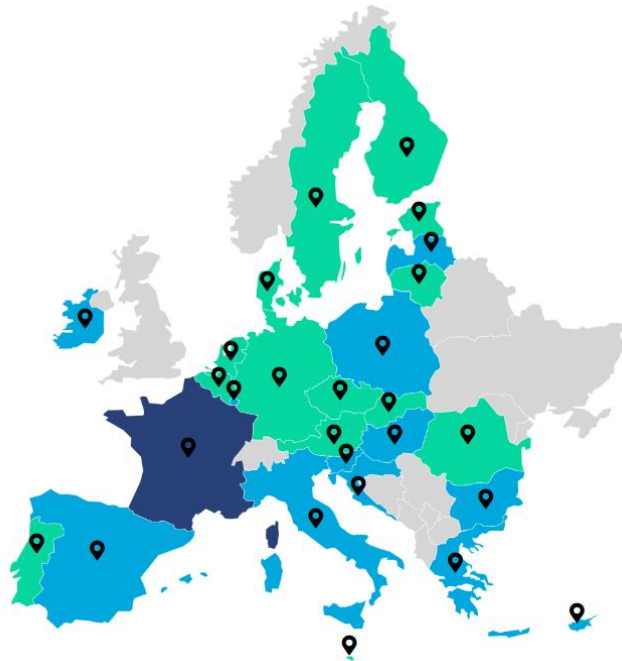

How does the Fit for 55 package and the revision of the Energy Efficiency Directive (EED)? The second edition of this paper coincides with the publication of the recast EPBD ((EU)2024/1275) in the Official Journal of the European Union (OJEU) in May 2024. As we approach the end of the current term of the European Parliament, the Energy Taxation Directive (ETD) remains in negotiation, however, we retain an assessment of the European Commission's proposal in the paper. ### Examples about targeting priority groups and tackling energy poverty

The new Energy Efficiency Directive (EU) 2023/1791, entered into force in October 2023, has introduced in its Article 8(3) a new requirement for Member States to achieve at least a minimum share of the energy savings among priority groups (e.g. energy poor or low-income households, vulnerable customers, social housing tenants). In this new set of examples, we looked at how energy efficiency schemes reported as contributing to alleviating energy poverty define their priority groups, how obligated parties need to demonstrate the eligibility of the beneficiaries (in case of Energy Efficiency Obligation Schemes) and how the results related to alleviating energy [...]
