



Energy Community Summer School Policy Paper

At the Energy Community Summer School, a 5-page policy paper typically refers to a concise and well-structured document that provides analysis, recommendations, or insights on a specific energy-related policy issue.

These papers are often used to:

1. **Address Key Issues:** Provide a focused discussion on a particular policy challenge or topic relevant to energy markets, sustainability, or regional cooperation.
2. **Propose Solutions:** Offer actionable recommendations or strategies that policymakers or stakeholders can consider.
3. **Support Evidence-Based Decision-Making:** Use data, research, and case studies to back up the analysis and proposed recommendations.

Structure of a Policy Paper (5 Pages)

A 5-page paper usually follows this format:

1. **Executive Summary (1/2 page):**
 - Brief overview of the topic, main findings, and key recommendations.
2. **Introduction (1 page):**
 - Context and importance of the issue.
 - Objectives of the paper.
3. **Analysis (2 pages):**
 - Description of the problem or challenge.
 - Relevant data, trends, or case studies.
 - Discussion of possible solutions or approaches.
4. **Recommendations (1 page):**
 - Clear, practical, and evidence-based recommendations.
 - Explanation of the benefits and feasibility of the recommendations.
5. **Conclusion (1/2 page):**
 - Summary of the main points and a call to action or next steps.
