### **Acquis on environment**



- ☐ Article 2(1)(d) Energy Community Treaty:
- "Improve the environmental situation in relation to Network Energy"
- = one of the objectives of the Energy Community Treaty

- ☐ Acquis on environment = means for achievining this objective
  - Mandatory
    - Environmental Impact Assessment Directive 85/337/EEC (2006)
    - Art. 4(2) Wild Birds Directive 79/409/EEC (2006)
    - Sulphur in Fuels Directive 1999/32/EC (31.12.2011)
    - Large Combustion Plants Directive 2001/80/EC (31.12.2017)
  - Not mandatory
    - Integrated Pollution, Prevention and Control (IPPC) Directive 2008/1/EC
    - Kyoto Protocol

# **Environmental TF – Objectives & Expectations**



- ☐ Large reliance on (old) coal-fired plants → challenge for implementation
- ECS proposal for establishment of a Task Force on Environment
- ☐ Proposal endorsed by Ministerial Council of 24 September 2010
- ☐ PHLG to adopt concrete mandate of the TF and to elect its Chair

- ☐ Advantages of establishing a Task Force on Environment:
  - Coordination and responsibility for implementation
  - Staged approach to implementation
  - Addressing problems at an early stage
  - Coordination at regional level
  - Involvement of all stakeholders

#### **Mandate of the Environmental Task Force**



#### ☐ Focus:

- Implementation of the *acquis* related to emission reduction = preparing implementation rather than review of already implemented *acquis*
- Transposition as well as implementation
- ☐ Composition of the Task Force

☐ Duration of the mandate and number of meetings

#### **Work Programme**



- ☐ Clarification of the Legal Framework
  - Explanation of implementation requirements
  - Reflection on the options and exploring the flexibility
  - Reference and proposals to the MC for adaptation or guidance
- Stock-taking
- ☐ Development of Action Plans and Roadmaps
- ☐ Technical, Economical and Financial Impact
- ☐ Implementation of Action Plans
