



DECISION OF THE MINISTERIAL COUNCIL OF THE ENERGY COMMUNITY

2025/05/MC-EnC on the failure by Georgia to comply with the Energy Community Treaty in Case ECS-7/24

THE MINISTERIAL COUNCIL OF THE ENERGY COMMUNITY,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the Energy Community ("the Treaty"), and in particular Article 91(1)(a) thereof;

Upon Reasoned Request by the Secretariat in Case ECS-7/24 dated 29 May 2024;

Having regard to the Opinion by the Advisory Committee established under Article 32 of Dispute Settlement Rules, dated 24 November 2024;

HAS ADOPTED THIS DECISION:

Article 1

Failure by Georgia to comply with the Treaty

1. By failing to adopt and apply the laws, regulations and administrative provisions necessary to comply with Directive (EU) 2019/944¹ and Regulation (EU) 2019/941,² as adapted and adopted by Decision 2021/13/MC-EnC, as well as with Regulation (EU) 2019/942,³ Regulation (EU) 2019/943,⁴ Regulation (EU) 2015/1222, Regulation (EU) 2016/1719, Regulation (EU) 2017/2195, Regulation (EU) 2017/2196, Regulation (EU) 2017/1485,⁵ as adapted and adopted by Decision 2022/03/MC-EnC, by 31 December 2023, and by failing to forthwith inform or notify those measures to the Secretariat, Georgia fails to comply with Articles 2 of Decisions 2021/13/MC-EnC and 2022/03/MC-EnC, as well as Articles 6 and Article 89 of the Treaty.

2. For the reasons sustaining these findings, reference is made to the Reasoned Request.

Article 2

Follow-up

1. Georgia shall take all appropriate measures to rectify the breach identified in Article 1 and ensure compliance with Energy Community law immediately. Georgia shall report regularly to the Secretariat and the Permanent High Level Group about the measures taken in 2026.

2. If the breach has not been rectified by 1 July 2026, the Secretariat is invited to initiate a procedure under Article 92 of the Treaty.

Article 3

Addressees and entry into force

This Decision is addressed to the Parties and the institutions under the Treaty. It enters into force upon its adoption.
